

### 3: How to Facilitate — Not Teach

**The BIG idea:** We already have a \_\_\_\_\_, we are simply \_\_\_\_\_!

*“The purposes of a person’s heart are deep waters, but one who has insight **draws them out.**”* Proverbs 20:5

**So, how did Jesus model this?**

*“What are you discussing together as you walk along?”*

Jesus, in Luke 24:17

**Facilitation Tips for group conversations:**

- Ask open-ended questions...
- Let silence do it’s work...
- Reflect what you hear...
- Redirect gently if someone dominates...

***What if someone asks a tough question?***

***What happens when you appear to have all the answers?***

***What if your posture was more interested in what everyone else was thinking?***

***What if you valued their contribution?***

Humility builds \_\_\_\_\_; appearing to have all the answers creates \_\_\_\_\_.

For reflection:

- Do you tend to fill silence quickly? Why do you think that is?
- What makes it hard to let conversations unfold naturally?
- How does Jesus’ approach in Luke 24 challenge your instinct to teach?
- What does it look like to trust the Spirit in moments of tension or doubt?
- How can you help ‘quieter voices’ feel safe to share?
